Zu3D and Kirkton of Largo

Kirkton of Largo Primary School is a small school (currently 31 pupils) located in Fife. We have two classes, P1-4 and P5-7, both of which use animation as a tool in their learning. We started using Zu3D around four years ago with netbooks and webcams and now we use Zu3D on iPads.





Moving between devices has been no problem for our pupils and it's great that the desktop and iPad versions are identical.

Animation is a great tool for our pupils to demonstrate and share their learning, in particular with P1-4 it is a great tool to retell stories or to tell their own.

On Monday afternoons we run a Skill Zone for the pupils, one of which was an animation group. This group had pupils ranging from P1 to P7 and we focussed on learning animation skills and using plasticine and the idea of morphing into something.





Each pupil worked individually, starting with a lump of plasticine then gradually changing it into something. Working individually allowed each pupil to develop their own skills and at their own pace.

Often for digital learning the pupils have worked in groups on animation.
